What we do

Recycling

We recycle all our glass, tins, paper, cardboard and plastic bottles. Please separate your rubbish and use the bins provided for recycling. The bins are clearly signed please follow the instructions.

Energy Conservation

We have recently installed a solar system which contributes to providing power for the camp site

We are replacing all the light bulbs around the site with low energy, long-life bulbs. Please try to save energy whenever possible. Do not leave taps running and switch off unnecessary lights. The lighting around the site is kept to a minimum to allow everyone to enjoy the night sky.

Thoughtful Purchasing

We use recycled paper or paper from sustainable sources. We use local producers and suppliers whenever possible.

Where possible we are using recycled and reducing packaging in the café.

We take pre orders for food to reduce food waste.

Prior to arrival, please think of the environment before making any purchases.

Transport

The best way to cut pollution is to reduce the number of car journeys. Please walk, cycle or use public transport whenever possible. Public transport is easily accessible from Manor Farm, a guide to local public transport and bus timetables are available on site.

MFC have purchased an electric UTV to reduce our environmental impact around the site.

Please pack wisely and only bring 1 car to site.

Trees and planting

We have planted every single tree and shrub on site at Manor Farm Camping. Recent projects are In March 2022 we planted over 650 trees and shrubs to the side of the camping area to creating a small woodland and nature reserve including Bee hives. In March 2023 we planted around 900 mixed trees and shrubs around the pond road. In March 2024 we planted mixed hedge rows between the family pitches. These will, eventually all, become wildlife havens and shelter for native creatures as well as natural wind breaks and privacy for campers!

What we plan to do

We intend to continue to increase the number of native plants and hedges around the site and replace non-native species. Some hedges will not be cut right back as these are important wildlife habitats.

Please respect the plants and wildlife and instruct your children not to harm them. Increase sustainable power on the site over the next 2 years

Manor Farm Camping are extremely proud of our grounds and take great care maintaining and improving them, on following these simple suggestions we can help to keep it that way. We are not perfect but are trying hard to reduce our impact on the environment and increase natural habitats for our wildlife.
